What were the names of Samuel's sons?


Were Samuel's sons good judges?

After looking for the lost donkeys in many places, why did Saul decide to return home after reaching the land of Zuph?





How did Samuel know Saul was coming and what God wanted him to do?





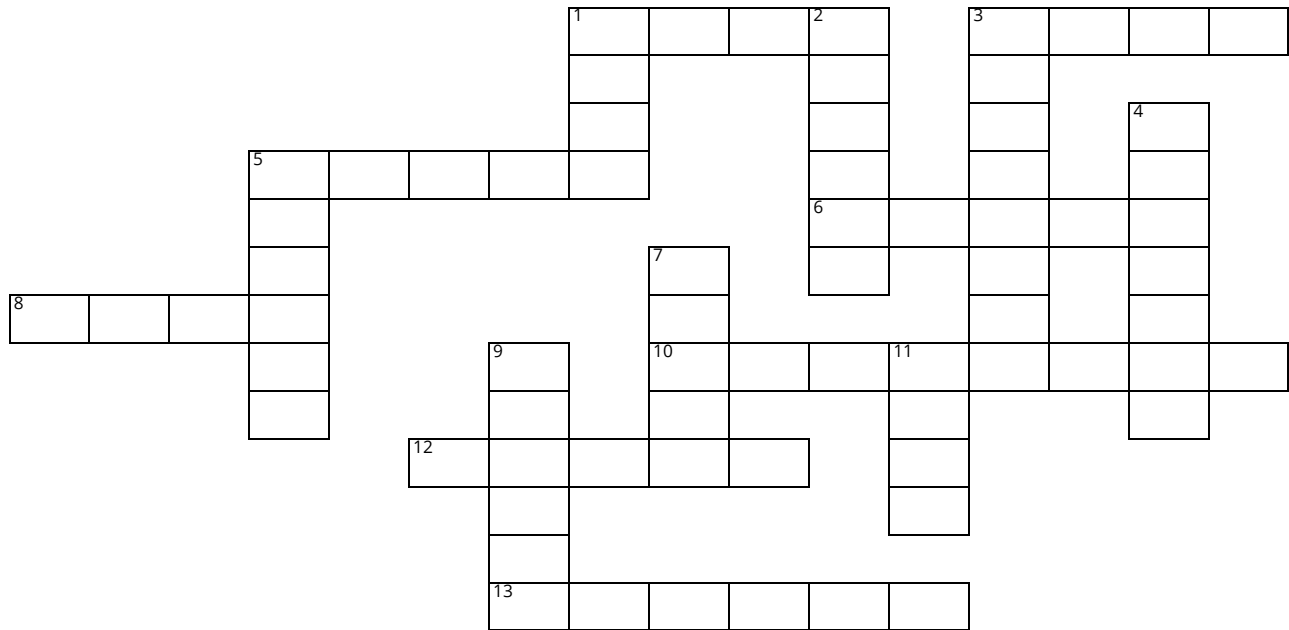

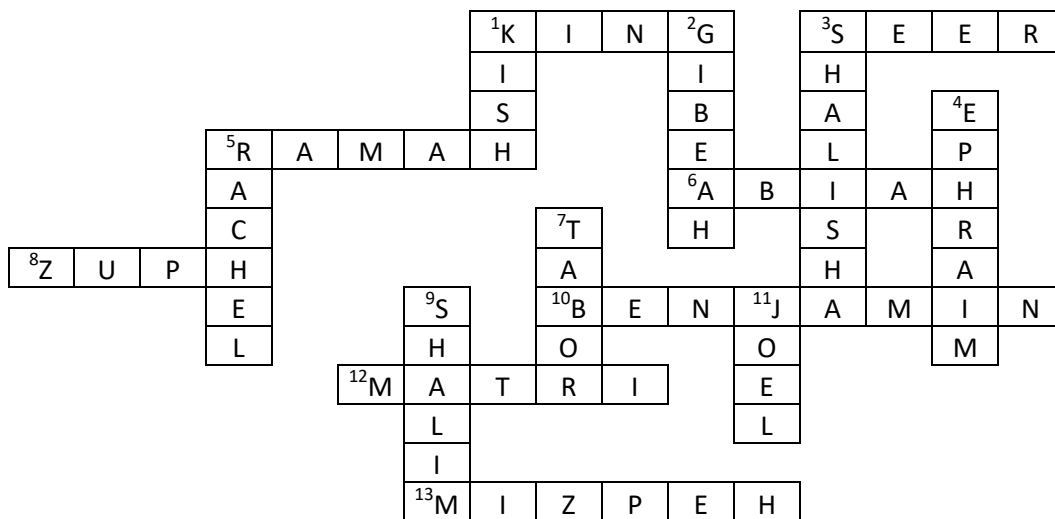
